2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes:

The IQAC asks the teachers to prepare their plan in an academic diary. They are also provided with academic calendar in the beginning of the session and are asked to make their teaching and evaluation plan as per the academic calendar. The IQAC frequently conducts the meeting to review the teaching learning process, in this meeting the academic diaries are checked and students' attendance is also checked. The results of the tests or assignments are discussed and remedies are also sought thereon. Regular absent students are communicated through telephonically or by sending letters to their parents. More use of ICT tools is suggested to the teachers by preparing a systematic time table of it. Students' participation in teaching and learning activity is stressed on. Evaluation files are also checked in this meeting to see the progress of the students. Through the Evaluation files IQAC gets the output of the teaching and learning process, as the files contain the performance of each student about Test, Seminars, Group Discussions, and Quiz Competitions.

The IQAC guides or suggests the teachers regarding teaching and learning activities. The clever students are supported more whereas the average students are provided various study material. Remedial classes are conducted for the slow learners. Guest lectures of some eminent persons are also organized for the students to give them more exposure. Students are also asked to make ample use of library services like newspapers, internet, reference books, encyclopaedias, and dictionaries Assignments and projects are allotted to the students with reference to the use of above study material. The library department has announced a prize for the students who will make ample use of library materials or sources. Cash prizes of about thirty five thousand are also distributed among the students for their meritorious performance in the annual university examinations. Teachers are asked to attend the refresher courses, orientation courses and short term courses to update their knowledge. Teachers are also encouraged to undertake innovative activities for the purpose of teaching and learning.

5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

The IQAC in a very first meeting with the teaching staff discusses on the points with respect to the Student Support Services. The college has been running the 'Earn and Learn Scheme' successfully through which many students are being supported financially. The IQAC has planned to support students financially to pay their examination fees or to waive of their admission fees those who are unable to pay. The girl students who commute from nearby villagers are helped to get their ST passes from the ST department as it is away from their residences. The advanced learners are helped by providing them additional study material like reference books, questions papers and assigning them curricular activities etc. The slow learners are supported with remedial classes and additional tests. For cultural and sports activities students are provided with extra coaching from internal as well as external expertise. The department of Career and Counselling Cell organized guidance classes as well regular classes for the Competitive Examination aspirant students. Projects under all departments are undertaken with the active participation of the students. Students are given the information about research paper writing and power point presentation. Various skills like soft skills, communication skills, job skills and personality development skills are imbibed among the students.

5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression

- 1) For academic tracking the college conducted various evaluation methods like seminars, group discussions, quiz competitions, and college level first and second term examinations.
- For co-curricular, extra-curricular activities various competitions are held like debate competitions, elocution competitions, and annual gathering and sports competitions.

- 4) A state level Research Paper Writing Competition was organized in which the college students achieved prizes.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

Yes, the college has the management information system. Every year the report about the same is sent to the Government of Maharashtra.

6.3Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Since the college has to adopt the syllabus prescribed by the University, the management has little scope for curriculum development. The management always wished and supported to start or to introduce new courses or programmes. The SGBAU Amravati has been restructuring the syllabus and examination patter from the session 2017-18. In this process the two staff members actively participated in this process. Prin. Dr. G.B.Jadhav worked as a chairman of the Board of Studies in Marathi and Dr. S.D.Chavan worked as a member of Board of Studies in English. Rest of the members suggested their suggestions through the Principal and Chairman or Member of the Board of Studies in their respective subjects. The management inspired the teachers for this activity.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The management always inspired the teachers for the optimum use of ICT tools in their teaching and learning process. The management has provided all necessary ICT tools for effective teaching and learning. The need, if any, from the side of the faculty is always taken into consideration for the development of this skill. Feedback from Principal and students are taken by the management with respect to the teaching and learning process in the college. Need about books is also taken quite positively and provided instantly to the college. The management has declared the cash prizes for the meritorious students. In the meeting of management the issue about the teaching and learning process is always discussed.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The institution supported to undertake more evaluation methods for students assessment. Moreover adequate material for conducting the internal first term and second term examination is also provided. Successful students are felicitated and failure students are counselled as well as their parents are also communicated. The institution advised to organize a pre-examination guidance programme for students. The teachers are supported for every activity to be undertaken for the evaluation of the students.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The institution has created quite healthy atmosphere for research in the college campus as the library of the college is well developed with the active participation and valuable guidance of the management. The teachers are well supported and inspired in the meeting management to attend the seminars, conferences and symposiums. The management provided adequate fund for the research activities organized in the college this year viz. a) The State Level Research Paper Competition for students. b) The State Level Power Point Presentation Competition c) The State Level Poster Presentation Competition d) Research Paper Seminar for the students. The teachers are also advised to publish their research papers in national level, international level, peer reviewed and Impact Factor journals. The teachers who are awarded Ph. D. Or M.Phil. degree if any are felicitated by the management at the end of every session.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The institution encouraged and allowed to upgrade the library facility. Every year as per the demand of the teachers and need of the students the tentative budget is placed before the management and this year too the management sanctioned the same. The institution allowed purchasing more computers and softwares, CDs. DVDs for ICT facility and for computer laboratory. This year a Xerox machine and physical infrastructure like tables, chairs, and benches are purchased for the students and different departments. The institution has given the autonomy to the Principal in respect of the above development, subject to the prior permission of the management. There was a need of auditorium as per the growing number of students hence the management considered the urgency and allowed to construct the same auditorium and will be completed by the end of the June. The work of renovation, updating and maintenance is sanctioned done accordingly. The work of college compound is also sanctioned and the same is going on.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

For internal administration of college there forty-nine committees formed and an action plan was asked from these committees along with their budget. Reports were also asked for and the committees worked as per their schedule and academic calendar. The institution managed its work with the available human resources. When there was urgency, the temporary teachers for academic session on CHB were recruited and workers were deployed on daily wages for any campus work. For the technical purposes the technicians and the mechanic were called with whom there is an agreement for a year for these purposes like electric purposes, equipment repairing, computer and other equipments repairing.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

During this year there were no appointments except of the Substitute teacher to the Assistant Professor of History who has been sanctioned the fellowship under FDP of UGC. The teachers for self financing courses are appointed on CHB. Besides the teachers for grant basis are also appointed on CHB with the approval of SGBAU Amravati. The procedure for appointment is observed as per the regulations of UGC and rules of Govt. of Maharashtra and SGBAU Amravati.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration.

The institution has given autonomy to the Principal regarding this activity. The Head of Commerce department with prior permission of the Principal conducted the industry visits. Dr. E.B.Bhalerao consulted the industry regarding the skill oriented course viz. Diploma in Horticulture, under community college to prepare the syllabus of the same. In addition to this, the college has collaborated with Meena Seeds, Jalna to run the Diploma in Horticulture Course as per UGC norms.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

Before the academic sessions began the teachers as per the action plan decided in the presence of management visited the villages. The teachers were asked to hold meetings with the villagers and organize the counselling session for the villagers with respect to the higher education of their children, especially girls. They were also given the pamphlets regarding college information and courses in the college. They were advised to seek admission of their children in the college for further education as most of them were found reluctant about the higher education.

Despite this, the institution adopted the policy of first come first serve basis but the reservation policy is also adopted to give the admission to the students. The students of outstanding achievement are given preference and the rules of university are also observed. The management decided to waive off the admission fees of the students who were unable to pay their admission fees. The students of SC, ST, NT & OBC category were admission at free of cost.

The present education system seems to be insufficient to provide government jobs to all students pursuing the education from the faculty like Humanities, Commerce and Life Sciences. While seeking education not only students but also their parents only think about the government jobs. The cut-throat competition amongst the students has been creating a feeling of depression if they are not able to seek the government job. The students in rural area are still unknown about the fact that there are ample opportunities of career making on the basis of skills. They still don't value the jobs which are available in the private sector which are sheer based on the marketing skills as well as Communication skills. Taking into consideration the frustration among the students with respect to the job achievement the college decided to impart the necessary skills among the students to make them able for employment and to create interest among them for learning.

2) Goals

- To train the students in Communication skills.
- To train the students in soft skills.
- To develop the students' writing skills, Reading Skills, and Speaking Skills.
- To make them able for presentations, Job Skills and in Computer Skills.
- To make them able in Marketing Skills.

3) Context

The remarkable shift in the job market has brought pressure and responsibility right to the steps of the educational institutions. It is well understood that skills should be part of any teaching programme and that it is the skills that make the students employable besides the acquisition of the degrees. It is with this in mind that the initiative was taken up and the plan was chalked out with the actual requirements of the job market to create will among the students for competing in the job market, equipped with necessary soft skills. The club aims to impart soft skills including communication skills, presentation skills, personality development skills, marketing skills, and job skills to help the students to acquire General English Skills and help to remove mental blocks involved in communication and job achievement. The activities are conducted through the 'Skill-Will' Club.

The students in our area are found apathetic with respect to their career opportunities. After negotiating with them it is found that they have been under very wrong impression about employment. They were just thinking about the governments jobs. When them came to know the ratio of application with the ratio of actual vacancies they are found frustrated in the context of education. This area has good opportunities of jobs in private sector as well as of self employment. Within the distance of one hundred K.M. there are two cities where there are the vast industrial areas where it is not so difficult to acquire jobs for the students which is their basic need. Hence taking into consideration the present scenario of the education system and the interest of the students the college has decided to establish the 'Skill-Will' Club for the needy students.

4) The Practice:

- In the beginning of the session the Principal and the IQAC held meeting with the faculty and communicated with the teachers the need of the students and their attitude towards the present education system.
- During the meeting the teachers were informed about the formation of the 'Skill- Will' Club for the students with the voluntary and active participation of the teachers and the students.
- Teachers from various departments agreed to conduct the classes on the various skills of which they are the expertise. The teachers decided to put special efforts without any remuneration beside their regular work.
- No fees is collected from the students for this club.
- The club identified a target group of 100 students through a simple test. The list of selected students is notified and initially an Orientation Programme is conducted for the students.
- They are made aware of the importance of the Skill Acquisition and the necessity of the 'Skill-Will' programme.
- Theory classes ranging from 15 to 30 hours are conducted besides 10 hours for practical work.
- Students already trained in the skills like Communication, Computing are roped in to train other students.
- Students are provided with the audio system, audio cassette, CDs, Language Laboratory, Computer Laboratory, and Digital Class Room with an interactive board with internet connections.
- The details of programme which are conducted are provided hereunder:
- Communication Skills, Soft Skills Development, Computer Skills, Personality Development and Job Skills.
- In these programmes students were given the practice of reading English news papers, pronunciation, Speaking English, writing letters of Applications, CVs, preparing email id, writing Email, faxes, net surfing, Notices, Agendas and Minutes, Cash Book, Ledger, Tally Software maintaining, Creative Writing, News Writing etc. Communicating, Group Discussions, Interview Techniques, Presentation as poster presentation and Power Point Presentation and Verbal Presentation etc.
- The students were given exercises in Language Laboratory, Computer Laboratory and in the Class Rooms. Home Assignments were also given and checked by the concerned teachers.
- Practical work for writing Cash Book, Ledger Book was conducted. Students
 were sent to the merchants in the town to write their cash book and to acquire
 the additional skills from them.
- Mock interviews were conducted in the college to teach the students the skills of facing interview.
- Workshop on Personality Development was also organized.
- Workshop on Soft Skills was also organized.
- Workshops on digital banking, mobile banking and internet banking were organised in collaboration with the bank authorities to let them know the cashless banking activities.

5) Evidence of Success:-

- The students are able to present themselves. The fear in the minds of students
 with respect to the self introduction and presentation seems to be vanished to
 some extent. The confidence amongst the students to present themselves is
 somewhat extended.
- Students seem trained in the skills like Communication and Computing as they have started to express in English to some extent either in the class or amongst themselves. They have also started to handle computer with respect to their needs like internet, Microsoft word, excel and power point.
- Students are using Language Laboratory, Computer Laboratory, and Digital Class Room and interactive board with internet connections to meet their requirements with the help of the teachers.
- The students are well acquainted with the skills like communication skill, Soft Skills, Computer Skills, Personality Development and Job Skills about which they were unaware. They have started to focus on the above skills along with their regular study. There are at least twenty to thirty students who showed their outstanding performance in various activities conducted durin the programme. The skill of anchoring is well development among the students as maximum programmes are conducted by the students in the college.
- Due to reading exercises given to the students they are found good at reading
 English news papers and English Books as very few mistakes are being
 committed by them in the matter of pronunciation and intonation. Due to
 writing exercises, writing letters of Applications, writing of CVs, preparing
 email id, writing Email, faxes, net surfing, Notices, Agendas and Minutes are
 possible to them to far extents.
- Students have written the Cash Books and Ledgers of the merchants in the town. They have also been skilled in using the Tally Software for account purpose.
- Creative Writing and News Writing skills are also developed among the students.
- Students are found talkative in Group Discussions, Mock Interview, Conducting Interview as they interviewed one of our teachers on the occasion of the Teachers Day in College.
- Presentation such as poster presentation and Power Point Presentation and Verbal Presentation etc are well known to the students and the college has organized the state level poster and power point presentation competition this year in which most of the students in the college participated and performed well.
- The students who were not participated in this activity are found interested to join this club next year.
- Students are able to use BHIM app, SBI Buddy App for cashless tranctions.
- The college students are able to fill their scholarships and competitive examinations forms online on their own in the college.

Best Practice - II

1) ICT as Teaching – Learning Process

While maintaining the quality of all aspects in the college in the present scenario we focus more on teaching learning process to make it more effective and influencing to get the desired output from our teaching and the other activities thereof. The complete understanding of the students of any particular unit or chapter and content is the main purpose of our teaching and learning process. The traditional methods of teaching are being found effective with respect to the perception of the students. Hence since last eight years the college and the teachers have been trying to make their teaching and learning process more effective by using the maximum ICT tools by all teachers.

2) Goals

- To upgrade the knowledge of the students with the help of the latest ICT tools
- To create competencies among the teachers with respect to the ICT tools for effective teaching and learning.
- To establish digital and ICT enabled teaching —learning process with our faculty as resource persons.
- To take the teaching and learning process out of the classroom and make it as Anywhere and anytime exercise at learners' speed and convenience.
- To train the students in the use of ICT tools by involving them in the process by their active participation.
- To create interest about learning amongst the students.

3) Context

The use of ICT in teaching —learning process has been envisaged to attempt at upgrading the teaching pedagogy in our college. This would not only make the learning experience through our institution more exciting and permanent, but also enhance the teaching capabilities of the teachers as facilitators of learning. It would also promote self-learning and help the students to gain knowledge at their own learning pace. It would create interest among the learners for learning and they would get exposure for their active participation in this process. They would be acquainted with new vistas of education system. They would also acquire the skills of handling the modern teaching aids like the interactive board and computers.

4) The Practice: The teachers and administrators of the college have always looked for the innovations in teaching and learning along the years. In a quest for 'any time anywhere' teaching—learning experience, the college has suggested the teachers to adopt the use of audio visual aids to at least fifty percent of total teaching. To achieve this end the teachers have been teaching with the help of slides, power point presentations, internet, dish T.V., DVDs, Computers, digital classrooms with interactive board and language laboratory.

In an effort towards self-learning, the students are also encouraged to prepare slides, PPTs, surfing the Internet, as a part of their assignments. This makes the teaching-learning process a two way process, involving both the teachers and the learners.

In an attempt to adopt more sophisticated ICT tools, the college has made available the multimedia material development for teachers and video conferencing facility in the digital classroom prepared in the college.

The teaching staff in our college is Computer Literate, able to handle the ICT tools for the purpose of teaching and learning. Most of them have undergone the training of handling the digital classroom and interactive board. The number of LCD projectors in our college is adequate to meet the requirements of the teaches and students. We have the educational DVDs and CDs available in our library which shown to the students very often as per the need of the syllabus. The special time table for digital classroom has been prepared for teaching to avoid the inconvenience of any class or teacher. Students are regularly taken to the digital classrooms either for teaching or for showing them certain educational videos either online or saved in the pen drives. This work is observed by a special committee. The various departments have been installed with projectors where students are taken as per the need of the teachers. Students' active participation in this process is always emphasised by giving them opportunity to handle these teaching tools.

The college intends to send more teachers for training with respect to Multimedia and Computer based teaching. The college wishes to increase the number of digital classrooms with interactive boards in near future.

5) Evidence of Success:-

- All teachers have started to use the ICT tools in their classrooms as per the need of the syllabus.
- Teachers are found more and more active in the task of teaching and learning.
- Students have been found interested in the process of teaching and learning better than the earlier methods.
- The active participation of students in the process of teaching and learning is increased
- Students are well acquainted with the modern ICT tools like interactive board, internet, computers etc.
- Students are receiving update knowledge about their subject in the classrooms.
- Students have started to take active part in the process of teaching and learning.
- Students have also started to prepare the slides of power point presentations with respect to their topics and present the same in the classroom in the form their seminars.
- The teaching and learning process have become more interesting job both for the teachers and the students.
- As a result the knowledge of the students with respect to their subjects seems to be increased as per their performance in the various evaluation methods.
- Students could achieve outstanding success in the State Level Research Paper competition organized in the college.
- Students could achieve outstanding success in the State Level Power Point Presentation Competition organized in the college.

7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection

- 1) A separate committee is functioning for the environment awareness.
- 2) Rally about trees conservation is organized.
- 3) More trees are planted in the college campus this year on the occasion of NSS foundation day.
- 4) Four hundred and fifty trees are planted in the town as well in adopted village by NSS and NCC on the day of Government's mission 'Target of two crore trees plantation.'
- 5) The college students participated in the construction of earthen dam on the local rive 'Amna' to percolate the water in the town area.
- 6) The students of NSS and NCC participated in the mass cleanliness drive organized in the town.
- 7) The students visited the people door to door and convinced them the importance of cleanliness and environmental awareness.
- 8) The volunteers of NSS performed the road play with respect to the environment conservation in the town as well as in the nearby villages.
- 9) The department of Chemistry undertook a project on the 'Enlightenment of the Farmers Regarding the Infertility of Soil and Contamination of Water due to overuse of Chemical Fertilizers.
- 10) The Department of Chemistry undertook a project with the active participation of the students on 'Slow Acting Poison of Plastic'.
- 11) A rally for 'Plastic Free Nation' was organized by the Environment Conservation Committee.
- 12) The department of Botany undertook a project on 'Pesticides and Human Health' with the active participation of students.
- 13) The department of Botany completed a project on 'Rainwater Harvesting' with the active participation of the students and the villagers.
- 14) Rangoli competition was organized on the 'Vasundhra Day' on 14th January 2017.
- 15) The department of Botany organized the State Level Poster Presentation Competition on 'Save Water Save Earth' on 20 February 2017.
- 16) Students were given oath for the conservation of water on the 'World Water Day' and the rally was also organized within the town on 22-03-2017.
- 17) A workshop on the preparation of 'Eco-friendly' Ganesh Idol was organized for the students of the schools and colleges in the town on 31-08-2017.
- 18) An awareness programme regarding the use of non-conventional energy sources in the town as well as in the villages with the active participation of the students.
- 19) A rally for water conservation was organized by the college in the town as well as in nearby villages.
- 20) The college requested and earned the e- class land about two acres from the Sarpanch of the adopted village, Pangari Mali for tree plantation and the college is going to plant trees like timber, fire and fruit yielding.
- 21) The college installed the 'Bird-Feeder' in the college campus.
- 22) Organic pesticides are sprinkled on the trees after regular intervals.
- 23) The vermi-compost project is run by the college with the active participation of the students and the same manure is used for the trees in the campus.
- 24) Trees are watered with the drip irrigation method in the college campus.
- 25) Students have adopted the trees in the campus for conservation and protection.
- 26) A video clip on the importance of Environment Conservation was shown to the villagers of Pangari Mali and the same was followed by an enlightening speech of one of the expertise in environment in our area.

Since this year the college has concentrated more on the active participation of the students in teaching-learning, co-curricular, extra-curricular activities, and community oriented activities. The teaches of all faculties have undertaken small projects with the active participation of the students. During the year there are twenty-eight projects undertaken by the teachers. These projects are based on the contemporary social issues which have not only developed the research culture among the students but also their social approach. The department of Botany has organized the state level poster presentation which received the overwhelming response across the state in which the students of our college also acquired prizes. The department of Chemistry organized the state level power point presentation competition. This competition was a very successful event and in this competition also the students of our college performed well and achieved prize. The SGABAU Amravati had organized a university level research project competition viz AVISHKAR' in which the students of Arts and Commerce faculty were selected for university level after their selection at district level. The construction of auditorium of 50×100 sq.ft, size is going on and will be completed by the end of the June 17. The new indoor stadium comprising the games like badminton, table tennis, wrestling, chess, carom has been made available for the students. The negative approach of the students and their parents toward higher education is an impediment in the way of development. We have opportunity of increasing the success ratio of the students in competitive examinations; hence we are paying more attention to such activities to be organized every year in maximum number. Since the complete staff is young and dynamic we have ample scope to develop in the field of research and other academic activities.

Plans of institution for next year

- The institution is going to celebrate the golden jubilee year for the session 2017-18.
- The institution has planned to organize various innovative activities for the celebration of the golden jubilee year.
- The institution has decided to extend the library in future to make it more equipped on the building of auditorium.
- The institution has decided to organize the National level seminars in the college.
- The institution has decided to plant more trees in the campus and is also thinking about solar panels in the administrative building of the college.
- The institution has planned to motivate the teachers for the online certification courses which will be useful for the betterment of the students.
